



## **Pump Efficiency Program (PEP)**

### **TERMS & CONDITIONS**

**PROOF OF PURCHASE:** Sales receipt(s) or invoice(s) itemizing the new equipment and indicating the size, type, make, model, purchase date, and vendor must accompany each Irrigation Pump Test Form after installation of improvements are complete. In addition, the customer must include details on the existing irrigation system to include the type of distribution system, pumping rate, acres irrigated, the quantity of water applied per acre, average annual hours of operation, total dynamic lift (ft.), pressure (psi), number of towers (if pivot) and note if changes occur to these items due to system improvements. The customer will also provide completed copies of the Pre-Improvement and Post-Improvement Pump Tests for the Pump Efficiency Program.

**INCENTIVE OFFER:** This energy efficiency incentive program covers equipment and installation during the program year in which it is purchased and installed. The customer must complete the installation of efficiency measures and submit all of the documentation identified above within twelve (12) months of notifying the local electric Utility of their intent to participate. Details of this program, including incentive levels, are subject to change without notice. The local electric Utility reserves the right to limit incentives.

At discretion of the local electric Utility, this program also covers the costs of up to \$350 for a Pre-Improvement Test, which will help identify and quantify the opportunities and savings potential associated with efficiency improvements. The local electric Utility also reserves the right to limit Pre-Improvement Test cost incentives.

In the event the efficiency improvement opportunities identified in the Pre-Improvement Test demonstrate a simple payback or return on investment from savings of five (5) years or less, and none of the suggested improvements are implemented, at the discretion of the local electric Utility, the customer may be liable for the full cost of the Pre-Improvement Test.

In the event the costs of up to \$350 for a Pre-Improvement Test is reimbursed by the local electric Utility and the contractor deducts the cost for a Pre-Improvement Test from the final bill, at its discretion, the local electric Utility may deduct the cost of the Pre-Implementation Verification Test (up to \$350) from the final incentive amount.

**ELIGIBLE EQUIPMENT:** Equipment must be new, installed, and operational at the customer's existing well. **NEW OR REPLACEMENT WELLS DO NOT QUALIFY!** At the discretion of the local electric Utility, systems converting from a fossil fuel source may qualify.

**ISSUING INCENTIVES:** Equipment must be purchased and installed before an irrigation efficiency incentive is issued. Falsifying any information may lead to cancellation of this and future incentive applications, a claim by the local electric Utility for the return of any incentives, and/or referral for prosecution. Please allow 45 days for delivery of incentives after the completion and submittal of the Post Improvement Efficiency Test. Submitting an application with incomplete or missing information may delay processing of the incentive. Irrigation efficiency incentives will not exceed more than 50% of the material and installation price.

**APPROVAL & VERIFICATION:** For the Pump Efficiency Program, incentives are calculated on the results obtained from a Pre-Improvement Pump Test and a Post-Improvement Pump Test. Testing must be performed by an irrigation contractor maintaining the proper licenses and/or certifications to do so. After the installation of the efficiency improvement(s) the Post-Improvement Pump Test is required to ensure energy savings are achieved. Data relating to both tests will be documented on the EnergyWises<sup>SM</sup> Irrigation Pump Test Form. The local electric Utility reserves the right to verify sales transactions and inspect all irrigation efficiency projects prior to and after installation for a period of up to three (3) years.

**TAX LIABILITY:** Neither the local electric Utility nor Nebraska Public Power District are responsible for any tax liability imposed on the customer as a result of the energy efficiency incentive.

**ENDORSEMENT:** Neither the local electric Utility nor Nebraska Public Power District endorses any particular manufacturers, products, nor system designs in promoting this program.

**DISPOSAL:** The customer/contractor is responsible for the proper disposal and/or recycling of any waste generated as a result of this project.

**SAFETY & ENVIRONMENTAL CODES:** The customer/contractor agrees that each irrigation efficiency measure complies with all federal, state, and local safety and environmental codes. All products must be installed per manufacturer's instructions.

**DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES:** Neither the local electric Utility nor Nebraska Public Power District warrant the performance of any equipment either expressly or implicitly. Contact the supplier or contractor for details regarding equipment warranties.

**ENERGY BENEFITS:** The local electric Utility is entitled 100% of the energy benefits associated with the implemented Energy Conservation Measure, excluding the value of energy cost savings realized by the Customer, but including all rights to all associated energy, capacity, reserved, and emissions. The Customer agrees to provide the local electric Utility with such further documentation as the local electric Utility may request to confirm the local electric Utility's ownership of such benefits.
