STANDBY IRRIGATION SERVICE RIDER TO IRRIG-1 RATE SCHEDULE
(Name of Schedule)

AVAILABLE: In the retail distribution service territory of the District.

APPLICABLE: To Customers with year-round irrigation service when all service is supplied through a single meter and who notify the District prior to June 1 of their intent to take Standby Irrigation Service under this Rate Schedule.

BASE RATE:

Subject to application of Retail Production Cost Adjustment (PCA) Rate Schedule.

<u>Fixed Charge*</u> :	<u>HP Installation</u> <u>(Rate Code 59)</u>	<u>kW Installation</u> <u>(Rate Code 58)</u>
Payable the 1 st billing period on or after May 1	\$17.75 per HP	\$21.41 per kW

*The total Fixed Charge shall not be less than \$321.00 for single-phase or \$447.00 for three-phase Customers.

If the Customer's energy usage exceeds 5 kWh/HP (6 kWh/kW) during the June 1 to September 30 summer season, the Customer will be billed for the difference in the total Fixed Charge under the Irrigation Service Rate Schedule (IRRIG-1) and the fixed charge of this Rate Schedule.

Energy Charge:

The IRRIG-1 energy charges shall apply.

BASE RATE ADJUSTMENT:

Lease Payment Adjustment:

The basic rates include higher distribution system costs associated with service in rural territory. For irrigation Customers in urban rate areas, the lower distribution costs are offset by the inclusion of the lease payment costs, resulting in the same basic irrigation rates, subject to the following adjustments, applied to irrigation Customers in both urban and rural rate areas.

TAX CLAUSE: In the event of the imposition of any new or increased tax or any payment in lieu thereof, in excess of that provided for under Article VIII, Section 11 of the Nebraska Constitution, by any lawful authority on the production, transmission, or sale of electricity, the rate provided herein may be increased to reflect the amount of such tax or in lieu of tax increase.

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STANDBY IRRIGATION SERVICE RIDER TO IRRIG-1 RATE SCHEDULE
(Name of Schedule)

Customers who are in urban rate areas, as established by distribution system boundary or rate area maps, and served from distribution facilities for which the District does not have a lease payment or debt service obligation will have the basic rates (excluding PCA but including applicable power factor adjustment) adjusted to exclude such lease payment and debt service costs by the following formula: Basic Rates x 0.88.

Customers who are in rural territory served from distribution facilities leased by the District upon whose revenues the District is obligated to make a lease payment will have the basic rates (excluding PCA but including applicable power factor adjustment) adjusted to include the lease payment by the following formula: Basic Rates ÷ 0.88.

Gross Revenue Tax Adjustment:

Customers located inside the corporate limits of a community, upon whose revenues the District is obligated to pay a five percent (5%) Gross Revenue Tax, will have the basic rates (including PCA and applicable power factor and lease payment credit adjustments) adjusted to include the five percent (5%) Gross Revenue Tax by the following formula: Basic Rates ÷ 0.95.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

1. All applicable provisions and terms and conditions of IRRIG-1 shall apply to this Rate Schedule.
2. Customers who have selected this rate option may not change to Off-Peak Irrigation Service Rate Schedule (IRRIG-2) or Interruptible Irrigation Service Rate Schedule (IRRIG-3) between June 1 and September 30.
3. The District retains and reserves the right, power and authority to modify, revise, amend, replace, repeal or cancel this Rate Schedule, at any time and in whole or in part, by resolution adopted by the District's Board of Directors.
